"Disciple Andrew" Matthew 10:2-4; John 1:35-42; John 6:8-14

The Mississippi River is more than 2500 miles long. In many places it is more than a mile wide. It travels through and along 21 states. Every day it spills trillions of gallons of water into the Gulf of Mexico. Barges of grain go down the river; supply barges and ships carry goods up the river.

The Mississippi River starts as a little spring in northern Minnesota. At its humble beginning you can almost step across the stream. The message of Jesus' life, death and resurrection first witnessed and then shared by the disciples is like the beginning of a small stream that becomes a river flowing to the world.

Andrew was one of four fishermen who were called as the first disciples. Andrew was the brother of Simon Peter whom we met last week. Andrew wanted others to meet Jesus. Andrew had been a disciple of John the Baptist. John the Baptist introduced his disciples to Jesus as the Lamb of God. John the Baptist knew that Jesus was sent to be the sacrifice for the sins of the world.

Andrew, who now followed Jesus, found his brother Simon and immediately shared, "We have found the Messiah" (John 1:41). The Holy Spirit gave Andrew the faith to believe in the Savior and the desire to tell about Him.

When the crowd following Jesus was hungry and the disciples were challenged by Jesus to find bread to feed them, Andrew was the disciple who brought a boy with five loaves and two fish to Jesus. Jesus took the boy's lunch, blessed it and shared the lunch so that 5,000 people were fed.

Sometimes we may feel jealous of a brother, sister, friend or classmate. We may not be as good of a student, athlete or musician or have some skill that someone else has. In those times, we can think of Andrew. Andrew is not as popular as his brother Simon Peter. What was important to Andrew is that others got to meet Jesus. Andrew wanted his family to meet and follow Jesus. We certainly want the members of our family to

learn about Jesus and believe in Him. Andrew wanted a little boy to meet Jesus.

We certainly want other children to learn about Jesus and believe in Him. In meeting Jesus, we meet the same Jesus that Andrew met and followed. Andrew met the Messiah, the Christ, who came as the Lamb of God to be the sacrifice for our sins and the sins of the whole world.

Be a disciple, like Andrew, and bring others to meet Jesus. Who can you bring to church, school or Sunday school so they can be Jesus' disciples for life with us?

Dear Jesus, thank You for Christian parents, teachers and others who have invited us to be Your disciples. Give us the mission desire of Andrew so that we can tell our family and friends about the Savior who suffered, died and rose for us and for all nations. Amen.
