## **Trinity Lutheran School**

"Disciple James"
Matthew 10:1–4; Mark 1:19–20; Acts 12:1–2

What does it cost? We think about and ask that question often. We may tell our parents about a new toy, electronics or item of clothing we think we need, and they may ask, "What does it cost?" If we use our own money to buy something, we think of the cost of the item. Do we have enough money? Do we want to use our money to buy the item?

There were no qualifications or charges for being a disciple of Jesus. All the cost was paid for by Jesus through His sacrifice on the cross. However, Jesus warned that His disciples would have to make some sacrifices in their life choices. Being a disciple could even cost their life.

James was one of the four fishermen called to be disciples. James and his brother, John, were the "sons of Zebedee" (Luke 5:10). Their father owned several fishing boats and had servants to help with the business. Most likely James and John were from a financially successful family. Part of the cost of their discipleship was leaving the family business to follow Jesus.

The mother of James and John wanted the best for her boys and wanted places of honor for them in Jesus' kingdom. Part of the cost was not having an earthly kingdom with important positions, but being humble in the kingdom of Jesus. Jesus did not come for earthly positions and power. Jesus came to make it possible for us to be part of His eternal kingdom. In that kingdom of grace, everyone has equal glory.

While James did not have any earthly treasures as Jesus' disciple, he did have some special experiences. James got to hear Jesus teach about the kingdom of God. James got to see Jesus perform miracles showing that He was the true Son of God. James got to see Jesus transfigured on the mountain. James, along with his brother, John, and fellow disciple Peter, got to have some special experiences with Jesus. James got to see that the Jesus who was crucified rose again from the dead. James knew Jesus was risen, and James was a messenger of that resurrection.

King Herod hated Jesus and hated the messengers who told about Jesus' resurrection. James was the first disciple who was killed (martyred) for preaching and teaching about Jesus.

Still today there are places in the world where Christians are put in prison, tortured and even killed for sharing that Jesus is the only Savior from sin. We pray for the courage to speak boldly about Jesus and to even be willing to suffer for Him.

Jesus, our salvation cost You Your very life, and we give You thanks and praise for making complete payment for our sins. Give us the courage of James to be disciples who are willing to count the cost and risk everything, even our very lives, to be faithful followers for life. Amen.
