Trinity Lutheran School "Disciple Matthew" Matthew 10:2–4; 9:9–13

"For I came not to call the righteous, but sinners" (MATT. 9:13).

Jesus made a surprising and unlikely choice when He chose Matthew to be one of His 12 disciples. In his own inspired Gospel, the Gospel of Matthew, Matthew describes himself as a tax collector. Matthew was a Jew who worked for the Roman government collecting taxes. The Romans had taxes on almost everything so they could pay for their army, to build roads and buildings and to operate the government. Besides working for an unpopular government, the tax-collectors had a reputation of cheating their fellow citizens by adding to the tax and putting the extra money in their own pockets.

The Bible often put the groups "tax collectors and sinners" together (e.g., Matt. 9:10). Jesus makes an unlikely choice and comes to Matthew, the tax collector, and says, "Follow me" (Matt. 9:9). The Gospel next tells us "And he rose and followed him." Matthew followed Jesus throughout His earthly ministry. Matthew followed Jesus all the way to the cross and saw that Jesus had risen again from the dead. The Holy Spirit used Matthew to write the Gospel of Matthew, sharing especially with his fellow Jews that Jesus was indeed the Savior who had been promised to Abraham and all his descendants. Disciple Matthew shares the Good News of Jesus and encourages all to follow Jesus' commission that he and the other disciples were to "make disciples of all nations" (Matt. 28:19).

God's Good News to us is that Jesus still makes unlikely choices. The Apostle Paul wrote that he was the worst of sinners, but yet God called him to share the message of Jesus with the Gentiles. God made the unlikely choice of choosing us to be His disciples. We were all born in sin. We have all committed sins of thoughts, words and deeds. Yet Jesus chose us to follow Him. God

used our parents and other disciples to bring us to the waters of Baptism so that we could follow Him for life.

God may have other unlikely choices to be His followers. We are privileged to "go into all the world" (Mark 16:15) and make disciples. God's grace is for everyone!

Dear Jesus, like Matthew we come to You as sinners. Yet, in Your grace, You have also called us to follow You. We may not write books about You, but with our spoken and written words, we can share the Good News of a Savior with others. Send Your Spirit to direct us, even to unlikely people in unlikely places. Amen.
