# **Trinity Lutheran School**

John 11:1–45

"Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?"" (JOHN 11:25–26).

Make a list of sad times: "When have you been sad?" "What makes you sad?" The list may include a wide variety of instances and responses: when my pet died, parents got divorced, grandparent died, we moved, friend lied to me and so on.

Because it's a sinful world, it is sometimes a sad world. Sadness is an emotion that every human being feels. Even though Jesus never sinned, as true man, He also felt sadness. The Bible tells us that when Jesus' friend Lazarus died, Jesus cried (John 11:35).

In today's Bible lesson, Jesus' disciples are sad because they also were friends with a family in the small town of Bethany. Mary and Martha were sad because their brother, Lazarus, had died. Jesus and His disciples went to be with the family in their sad time. Lazarus' sister Martha met Jesus and shared her sorrow. Knowing that Jesus had done many miracles, Martha suggested that Jesus could have stopped her brother from dying.

It had not been Jesus' purpose to stop the physical death of Lazarus. Jesus had a great purpose in His coming. Jesus had come to experience physical death Himself. Jesus would die on the cross. Jesus would die and be buried in the tomb. Jesus would rise again. Jesus announced that He is "the resurrection and the life. Whoever believe in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die."

Jesus would perform another amazing miracle and raise Lazarus from the dead. The sadness of the family and disciples would go away. However, at some point, Lazarus would die again and there would be sadness again. But because Lazarus, Mary and Martha believed in Jesus' death and resurrection, they would live again. When Jesus comes on the Last Day, He will raise them, His faithful disc-

iples and all who believe in Him as the "resurrection and the life."

We are still in the Lenten season. We are still following Jesus through His passion to the cross. However, we already know the Good News at the end of the story. Jesus would rise from the dead and so will we.

There will be sad times in our lives. We are sad at the death of those we love. However, our sadness is only temporary. We will have life eternal through Jesus' resurrection.

Dear Jesus, even as You stood at the tomb of Your friend Lazarus, we have stood at the graves of family members and friends we love. Thank You for Your resurrection and the assurance that You are the Life. Continue to bring life to us as Your disciples. Amen.
