Join Us for Bible Study at Trinity Lutheran Church

Trinity Lutheran School SPIRIT OF LIFE Acts 2:1-21

"And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams" (ACTS 2:17).

Complete this sentence "I can't wait for..." If Jesus' disciples had an "I can't wait for ..." list, it may have included "the Holy Spirit."

The disciples couldn't wait for the coming of the Holy Spirit. The Old Testament prophet Joel had shared God's promise of the Spirit hundreds of years before Jesus was born (2:28). Jesus had promised that when He physically left the disciples, He would send the Holy Spirit (John 14:1–17, 25–26). Shortly before Jesus' ascension, He promised again, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you" (Acts 1:8).

God always keeps His promises. Pentecost is the celebration that God kept and keeps His promise of the Holy Spirit. Today's Bible reading (Acts, Chapter 2) tells the story of the Spirit's coming with a rushing wind, tongues of fire and unfamiliar languages.

The Holy Spirit used Disciple Peter to share the Pentecost sermon. Peter's message was, "I can't wait to tell you about Jesus." Peter told about the unfair treatment of Jesus and the cruel condemnation to crucifixion. Peter shared that Jesus had died even for those who had crucified Him. Peter preached that Jesus rose again to bring new life to all who believe in Him. The disciples were blessed to see and receive everything that they had waited for since they began to follow Jesus. The Holy Spirit brought all of God's gifts to them.

We don't have to wait for God to keep His promise of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit who came to the disciples came to us in our Baptism. The Spirit didn't appear to us with wind and fire. The Spirit came to us in the water of Baptism. The Holy Spirit comes to us in God's Word and gives us faith in the death and resurrection of Jesus.

Because the Holy Spirit has come to us and because He continues to bring God's Word to us to keep us in faith, we can trust in all of God's promises. We can say, "I can't wait to be with Jesus in glory."

With the power of the Holy Spirit, we, too, are Jesus' disciples and witnesses. Complete this statement: "I can't wait to tell (names) ... about Jesus."

Dear Jesus, we are thankful that You keep all Your promises. Thank You for sending the promised Spirit to the disciples in Jerusalem. Thank You for sending the Holy Spirit to us in our Baptism. Continue to send the Spirit to us so that we might make disciples who know of Your saving work and follow You for life. Amen.

Not able to camp with us? Then join us for the day on Saturday for fellowship and a lunchtime potluck meal.


The campground does not charge a fee for guests to visit.
