

TRINITY LUTHERAN SCHOOL

It's all Connected Matthew 16:21–28

"From that time Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised" (Matt. 16:21).

Think of Lego-collections to be assembled. Do you like to connect Legos? What are some of your favorite Lego constructions?

Jesus gathers with His disciples near the end of His earthly ministry. God's plan of salvation had been very clear from the beginning of time. Immediately after the Fall, God promised a Savior from sin. God shared "pieces" of promises with the patriarchs and through the Old Testament prophets. During His earthly ministry, Jesus continued to share the pieces of God's plan: He was the Son of God who had come to save sinners. Today's Bible reading makes Jesus' mission very clear: "From that time Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised" (Matt. 16:21).

Even though Jesus had shared and shown His disciples the pieces of the plan many times, they still couldn't picture how all



the promises and "pieces" would fit together. Peter. concerned about Jesus' journey, says "This shall never happen to you" (Matt. 16:22). Peter ultimately saw Jesus go to the and die. cross Three days later, Peter went to the



tomb and saw that it was empty. Peter then saw the resurrected Jesus and declared his love for Him.

God not only has shown us the pieces of our salvation; He has assembled the pieces and shown us the fin-

ished new creations. The Holy Spirit brings the pieces together for us so that we can believe that Jesus suffered and died for us and see the completion of Jesus' salvation. In our Baptism, Jesus connects us to His death and resurrection, and brings us into the church with Him. We are the pieces which, through Baptism, the Holy Spirit assembles to build the church.

Sometimes, like Peter, we find it hard to believe that God could assemble us into His special display. It sometimes seems impossible to assemble the pieces that lay on the table. We give thanks that we can learn God's Word in our classrooms and hear God's Word in our chapel services and during Sunday worship. We can see that God has assembled a special creation for us and with us.

"If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you" (John 15:7).

Jesus, the most amazing collection ever assembled is the promises and pieces of our salvation. We ask You to hold us together in Your holy church. Use us to connect others to You. Amen.
