Connecting to Forgive Matthew 18:21–25

"Then Peter came up and said to him, 'Lord, how often will my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?' Jesus said to him, 'I do not say to you seven times, but seventy-seven times'" (Mat. 18:21–22).

Think of pairs of numbers without any mathematical "connections": 3, 1, 7, 4, 2, 8, etc. A list of just numbers is confusing and useless. We don't know what to do with them. If we had "connecting" directions, the numbers become meaningful: 3 + 1; 7 - 4; 2×8 . With the "connecting sign" we can solve the problem.

The disciple Peter comes to Jesus with a numbers problem: "How often should I forgive my brother?" What's a good number, Jesus? How about seven times?" Jesus replies that Peter should forgive "seventy-seven times," and then tells a parable emphasizing that forgiveness is not a matter of numbers.

Our parents and teachers may use numbers to warn us: "That's the first warning!" "I'm counting to ten, and before I get there, I want you to get started cleaning your room." We are tempted to use numbers in counting the sins and hurts from others. "That's the second time you lied." Peter suggested "seven" as a generous number of times to grant forgiveness.

If God were to count our sins, we would have a major numbers problem. In addition to our sinful nature, we sin constantly with our thoughts, words and deeds. The prophet Jeremiah spoke for himself and the people of Israel when he said, "their transgressions are many" (Jer. 5:6). Our sins are too many to count. If calculating our sins were a math problem, we would be multiplying and multiplying!

Jesus tells a parable about forgiveness. The servant of a king had a huge debt (lots of numbers!). The servant's debt was forgiven by a kind and generous master. The Good News is that Jesus is the Master who paid the debt. Through His suffering and death on the cross, He paid the price for every sin. The blessings of Jesus' death and resurrection are ours in our

Baptism. He has washed away every sin. The prophet Isaiah said that the Savior to come would "blot out your transgressions for my own sake, and I will not remember your sins" (Isaiah 43:25). God no longer counts our sins because in Christ, He has removed them and forgotten them. In our math illustration, God uses a great big subtraction sign when it comes to our sins. No matter the number of our sins, He subtracts every sin. His final answer is "0."

Jesus' parable continued with another important lesson. Because God no longer counts our sins, we should not count the sins of others against us. Jesus said, "And should not you have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?" (Matt. 18:33). In the Fifth Petition of the Lord's Prayer, Jesus teaches us to pray, "And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

It's important to learn how to add and multiply. But when it comes to the sins of others, we must learn to subtract through the love and example of Jesus. How many times do we forgive? Many times. We should always count their number of sins as "0".

PRAYER

"If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you" (John 15:7).

Jesus, thank You for dying and rising again so that all my sins are subtracted. We ask that You continue to teach us to forgive others. Amen.
