

TRINITY LUTHERAN SCHOOL

Concrete Connection Matthew 21:33–46

Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the Scriptures: 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; this was the Lord's doing, and it is marvelous in our eyes'?" (Matt. 21:42).

Look at a piece of concrete. What holds the small pieces of sand and rocks together? Why is this connection important? Where do we find this type of connection in our home, school and other places?

Construction materials were obviously different in Jesus' day. They didn't have concrete mix and other materials that we have today. In some ways, they had to be more careful and creative with construction. Stones were carefully selected and put in place. Jesus uses a construction example in today's lesson.

Since the fall into sin, God had been putting the "stones" of His salvation in place. Each piece was carefully selected and placed. Many people could not and would not understand what God was building. They thought they could build their own structures that would be pleasing to God. Like the servants sent into the vineyard, they rejected many of the stones that God had put in place. Obviously their "construction" would fall apart because it was made by human hands.

God did not give up on His plan of salvation. He would continue to put every piece into place. The final "stone" was Jesus. He was the Cornerstone. God put that final piece into place on Good Friday. Jesus Himself announced from the cross, "It is finished." The devil thought everything would crumble when Jesus died. Even as the earthquake hit the city of Jerusalem and buildings crumbled, Jesus stayed on the cross.

God's construction of the salvation of the world would stand forever. No earthquake, fire or any other natural or man-made disaster could destroy what God had built for us. Because of Jesus, our salvation is sure.

Oftentimes, it seems like things are crum-

bling around us. Sometimes it seems like things in our family are crumbling. Sometimes our relationships with our friends are crumbling. Sometimes things don't go like we had planned. We can't hold things together. But Jesus is the cornerstone of salvation. His promises are always true and sure. His plans and "construction" are always marvelous.

PRAYER

"If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you" (John 15:7).

Jesus, thank You for being the concrete and cornerstone of our salvation. We ask that You help us to continue to build our lives on You. Amen.

Our meetings and events are primarily the 3rd Tuesday monthly at 6:30 p.m. in the Small Fellowship Hall. Additional dates and/or time changes will be posted. Ladies of Trinity, we invite you! We aim to have speakers, projects and events but we believe fellowship and support for our Sisters in Christ is equally important. We are a service organization with a mission to affirm our relationships with our Triune God so we are enabled to use our God-given gifts in ministry to the people of the world, near and far.

We especially treasure our elderly and shut in members of our congregation; we keep them in our prayers as well as calling and visiting them. Cards are also sent to members who are ill, have lost a loved one or just need encouragement.

The quilters meet every Monday at 9 a.m. in the Small Fellowship Hall. Anyone is invited to join us and stay as long as you'd like; there is a job available for everyone. In the past year our quilting crew has made 151 quilts for World Relief and Pillars Homeless Shelter and have also donated 75 blankets, 78 pillows, 26 sheets, 259 pillowcases, 2 bedspreads and 6 towels to Pillars. These ladies are truly a blessing to many! Several ladies also make quilt tops from home.

Elaine Weinig is our funeral meal coordinator. We continue to provide salads and desserts and prepare most of the food that is served at the funerals for our Trinity members. We appreciate any assistance with the food, serving the meal and cleanup; we pray we can always continue this service for our families.

We collect Mites each month, of which 75 percent goes to South Wisconsin District to satisfy the grants chosen; that goal is a 2 year commitment for a total of \$205,000. The national mite goal is set at \$2,350,000 over a two year span. You are always welcome to take a mite box (available on the table in the narthex) and help us collect. We can also show you where these mites actually go and the grants that the mites will satisfy. Trinity has contributed a total of \$628.83 to the Mite Ministry in the last year.

We again thank Trinity Congregation and our dear Pastors for your continued support and prayers for our Trinity Ladies Aid/Lutheran Women's Missionary League.
