Connected To the Power Source Matthew 25:1-13

"But the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps" (Matt. 25:4).

If a weather forecast warns you about possible storms such as tornadoes or blizzards , your family may prepare for the situation by having light sources available in case the electricity goes out. It's important to not only have the light flashlight but also to have batteries in the source.

The women in Jesus' parable in today's Gospel reading weren't preparing for a storm. They were preparing to make a nighttime trip to a wedding celebration. In Jesus' time, they didn't have battery-powered lights. They had lamps that needed a supply of oil to keep the lamp burning. Some of the women were prepared with fuel for their lamps. Some were not prepared and would miss the celebration.

The lesson in Jesus' parable is much more important than having lamps or lights powered. The Bible teaches that Jesus will come again on the Last Day. Jesus, who came to earth as true man to die for us. Jesus, who completed the plan of salvation and rose from the dead. Jesus, who ascended into heaven, will come again to judge the world and welcome us and all believers to be with Him. While we know that Jesus will come again, we don't know when He will come. Jesus' story teaches that we should always be ready for when He comes again.

Being ready doesn't involve having lamps with oil or lights with batteries. Jesus prepared us for His coming by giving us faith. The women in the story without oil were those who were not waiting in faith for Jesus. Jesus has given us the power of our Baptism and the power of His Word. We do not have to worry about being ready. When Jesus comes, we will be part of the celebration because we have faith in Him.

Because there are people who do not have the fuel of faith, they continue to experience the storms of doubt and despair. We have the privilege of sharing the Good News that Jesus has come, and He wants all to be ready to welcome Him.

PRAYER

"If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you" (John 15:7).

Jesus, thank You for giving me the fuel of faith. We ask that You continue to keep us ready to receive You. Amen.
