Altar Guild Help Needed


Trinity is in dire need of volunteers to serve on our Altar Guild team. Tasks are:

New Guidelines for Altar Guild From Pastors Billings & GeRue

The Pastor's would like to have:

- Communion set up like we did before COVID.
- The first 2 rows should have all the holes in the Communion trays filled, with only the middle of the tray open for the Pastor to put nonalcoholic cups.
- Put 16 oz in the flagon on Saturday
- Put 20 oz in the flagon on Sunday
- Have one extra tray in the fridge
- Make sure to have unconsecrated wafers separate from consecrated.
- Always have unconsecrated wafers in the bottom tray of the large paten (nonalcoholic tray).

Catechetical Comments

A Series

THE APOSTLES' CREED

This month we continue our look at The Apostles' Creed and consider the following questions: *Which creed is used in Luther's Catechism?* and *Why is it called the Apostles' Creed?*

90. Which creed is used in Luther's Catechism?

91. Why is it called the Apostles' Creed?

The creed found in the *Small Catechism* is the Apostles' Creed. It's called, as the *Catechism* explains:

"... not because it was written by the apostles themselves, but because it states briefly the doctrine (teaching) that God gave through the apostles in the Bible."

The Creed is trinitarian because Scripture reveals God as triune.

The *Catechism* lists two Scripture passages in this context. One shows the three-fold nature of God; the other shows God's unity.

Matt. 28:19 – Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Eph. 4:4-6 – There is one body and one Spirit – just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call – one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

Following Jesus' admonition, Christians are baptized in the name of the triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

I've often been intrigued by this formula. We often encounter non-creedal Christians who object that the words "trinity" or "triune" are

not in the Bible. While this may be true technically, it is not true to suggest that the concept of the Trinity is not found in Scripture. The reality is that it is found all over the place, in both Old and New Testaments.

Jesus' baptismal formula is a classic example. Notice the tenses:

"... make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the *name* of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

"Name" is singular, but how many names does Jesus mention? "Father, Son, Holy Spirit" – three names.

This formula also gives us not only the number of Persons in the godhead, but their relationship to us *and to each other*.

It was St. Augustine who suggested that the words "and the Son" be inserted into the Nicene Creed regarding the sending of the Holy Spirit, on the understanding that the only thing separating the Persons of the Trinity is their relationship to each other: the Father is not the Son, nor the Holy Spirit; the Son is the Son and not the Father, and so on. So, to say, as the Nicene Creed did originally, that the Spirit is sent by the Father only, is to begin unraveling the doctrine of the Trinity, for what is it that distinguishes the Spirit from the Father and the Son? He is sent, which means the Father and the Son must be the senders. More on this at another time. \(\frac{1}{2}\)

Making Disciples for Life Matthew 28:18-20

This year, we will be blessed to frequently hear Jesus' words of Matthew 28, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations" (v. 19). We will go with Jesus and His disciples through His earthly ministry, to the cross and out of the tomb.

We will also learn that Jesus called us to be His disciples. Jesus' words "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" were first spoken to us in our Baptism. We, too, are children of God. We, too, are disciples following Jesus.

We are blessed to be His disciples and to make disciples so that Jesus' presence will be known by everyone.

Dear Jesus, through Your Word You have been present in every aspect of our school year. Thank You especially for Your presence in our weekly worship together. We know You go with us from school to our homes, community and many summer activities. Thank You for making us Your disciples, and keep us faithful for life. Direct us through the Spirit to continue to make disciples in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

September Stewardship Message: The "How" of Our Offerings

The Board of Stewardship has just completed a three-part series of messages, where we talked about the "whys", "whats", and "whens" of biblically giving back to our Lord. Today we'd like to speak about the "how" of our offerings.

You all recognize our blue Trinity offering envelope. Many of you use it to give your regular tithe to God's Work here by either dropping it in the plate on your way into worship, or via the church office or by mail. But, some of you have found other ways of giving easier for your needs.

- Trinity offers the opportunity to give your offerings and tithes online via the *Joyful Response* program. This program is sponsored by the Lutheran Church Extension Fund through Vanco Services, LLC. By enrolling in this program your recurring tithes and offerings will be automatically deducted from your checking or savings account, at whatever amount and interval you choose, and then deposited automatically here at Trinity. You can contact Steve Reinke in the church office for additional details.
- Many people today are paying their bills via bank draft. Similarly, you may wish to contact
 your financial institution to see if they can automatically send a payment on your behalf
 directly from your bank account to Trinity each week or month.
- If you are a *PayPal* user, you can tithe to Trinity this way. Information on PayPal offerings can be found on Trinity's website. Note PayPal offerings do incur a processing fee to Trinity at around a 2% amount.
- If you are at least age 70½, you can have your financial advisor make regular offerings from your *investment accounts* directly to Trinity, eliminating tax issues.

A few questions you may have:

- By giving electronically, can I still control the various funds that I'd like my offerings to go to? The answer is yes, with both Vanco and PayPal!
- Can I plan what frequency I give my tithes electronically? The answer is yes Vanco can be setup to be weekly, monthly, or semi-monthly. PayPal you can dictate frequency or send your offering manually on your schedule.
- I like the idea of giving electronically, but still would like to keep my envelopes for other offerings...can this be done? Answer is yes, and we encourage you to do this!
- As **you** have questions, please reach out to Steve Reinke in the Church Office!

Many have found, by giving electronically, first fruits giving is so much easier, in that you determine the timing of your tithe (and you don't need to remember to bring, and drop in, that envelope each week....). Whatever way we choose to give our offerings back to our Lord, may we always keep in mind the opening words of our Offertory which are taken from Psalm 116: "What shall I render to the Lord for all his benefits to me?"

4 Remedies for Sciatic Pain
