



Catechetical Comments

A Series

THE APOSTLES' CREED

This month we continue our look at The Apostles' Creed and consider the following question: *Who is God?*

93. Who is God?

In His Word God has told us that He is

I. faithful (keeping His promises)

The *Small Catechism* further answers the question *Who Is God?* by saying:

In His Word God has told us that He is

I. faithful (keeping His promises)

It then offers the following Scripture passage in support of this answer:

2 Tim. 2:13 – If we are faithless, He remains faithful – for He cannot deny Himself.

"How many times have I let you down?" It's a dangerous question, one that you'll do well to ask only of those people you trust and only if you're ready to have your feelings hurt, for without doubt, if you're anything like me, you've let a lot of people down on a lot of occasions, and even though (most of the time) you didn't intend to, you did it anyway. Why? Because – get ready to be shocked – you're human, completely and unquestionably human.

God, on the other hand, apart from the shared natures in Christ, is not human, and even where Jesus is concerned, His human nature is governed by His divine nature, and, therefore, He is not subject to our human frailty in a sinful way [cf. Heb. 4:15].

Lazarus' sisters, in their grief, apparently forgot this and accused Jesus of a lapse in faithfulness for not answering their summons when Lazarus lay dying. Being sinful humans, they apparently projected their sinful behavior onto the sinless One, thinking Him capable of failing them in their hour of need. But Jesus is not like us; He does not let us down. As Paul writes to Timothy – "If we are faithless, He remains faithful" (2 Tim. 2:13a).

The situation with Lazarus is instructive for us. Do we not feel as Mary and Martha felt when our prayers seem to go unanswered? Think about this: Their loved one was sick, apparently dying. The sisters sent urgent word to Jesus that this close friend of His was in desperate need of His help. And He intentionally delayed responding, as though He didn't care. Ever felt as though God doesn't care about you? Maybe you've had a loved one at the point of death and you prayed for healing, but they died anyway. At times like this, doesn't it feel like God doesn't care?

But look what happened in the end! Even better than keeping him alive, Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead! How many people came to faith in the Savior because of this? If, through your tragedy, people come to faith in Christ, doesn't that make the tragedy worthwhile?

Every parent understands that sometimes, to be faithful to your children, you have to deny them what they're asking of you, because you know what's best for them and that your plans for them are better than their plans for themselves. True faithfulness lies in doing what is best, not simply what is desired. God always does what is best, and is, therefore, always faithful. 🕂

So, let's be proud of who WE are! **Proud** to be children of God. **Proud** to [try to!] live chaste and decent lives in all we say and do (Small Catechism, Sixth Commandment). **Proud** of our Savior who died that we might live. **Proud** to defend the life of all people, from the womb to the tomb. **Proud** to bear the name of Christ. **Proud** to be Trinity Lutheran Church and School. **Proud** to serve others. **Proud** to stand up for the biblical definition of marriage. **Proud** to confess only one true God and only one way to eternal life - through Jesus! **Proud** of the rainbow as a sign of God's promise, not as a symbol of depravity. **Proud** to confess that God made us in His image as male and female only and that He doesn't make mistakes. **Proud** that Jesus died for all people, loves all people, and wants to save all people, even those who hate and persecute us. **Proud** that the Bible is God's eternal, unchangeable Word and truth. And what else? Lots more, to be sure!

So, let's take back "Pride!" Let's make it all about Jesus and the life we have in Him.

<u>Living a Life of Hospitality - Stewardship October 2023</u>

This month we would like to talk about living a life of hospitality. Do you remember your school days when you didn't want to be seen with someone like that? "Who will I sit with in the cafeteria today?" "I want to be noticed, included in the right group". Perhaps <u>you</u> were the "someone like that." Maybe picked on, ignored, or fit in the lower-class group.

You remember that? What was that all about? It was all about "Image", right? You really had to pick the table or group based off what you wanted people to think about you. Was this hospitable? Was it? The bigger question is, do you continue to be concerned about your image today and does it inhibit your hospitality capabilities today?

What does Jesus say about hospitality? Matthew 22: 37-39 reads as follows: Jesus said to him, "you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and with all your mind." This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

There are a lot of things that we put in the way of opening up to others. Usually, all our reasons and excuses to not live hospitably all come back to that image, which is pride! It would be easy to approach one of our Pastors or Leaders and engage in a discussion, but it would be uncomfortable to simply walk up to someone you don't know or haven't seen in church before and introduce yourself. How about that person sitting at a table in the mall alone looking like they really need someone to talk to?

We all like to think of ourselves as hospitable. We're friendly enough. We show hospitality, right? Are we really as hospitable as we think? Biblical hospitality is literally a "love of strangers." Biblical hospitality is showing sacrificing love. It's treating others as family, even strangers and "those people like that".

So, your Board of Stewardship challenges you to "Live a God Lived Life of Hospitality." How do I do this you say? Some suggestions:

- 1. Invite a visitor at church to attend Bible Study with you.
- 2. Invite a church member that has never been to your home to lunch or dinner.

- 3. Have a 60 second conversation with three people you don't regularly talk to at church.
- 4. Find a way to introduce yourself to your neighbors.
- 5. Sit next to someone you don't know at church and strike up a conversation with them.
- 6. Attend one of our Sunday morning Bible Studies
- 7. Find someone in church that seems to be involved and ask how you can help.
- 8. Visit a shut-in member in person
- 9. Look up bible passages to hear what God has to tell you about hospitality.
- 10. Pray for God's guidance in making you a more hospitable person.
- 11. Remember that your hospitality is not limited to this Congregation, reach out to the community.

We close today with Jesus' encouragement in Luke 14: 12-14: When you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends, your brothers or relatives, or your rich neighbors; if you do, they may invite you back and so you will be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed. Although they cannot repay you, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.


