





READING ISAIAH 44:1–5

P A reading from Isaiah, chapter 44.

<sup>1</sup>"But now hear, O Jacob my servant, Israel whom I have chosen! <sup>2</sup>Thus says the LORD who made you, who formed you from the womb and will help you: Fear not, O Jacob my servant, Jeshurun whom I have chosen. <sup>3</sup>For I will pour water on the thirsty land, and streams on the dry ground; I will pour my Spirit upon your offspring, and my blessing on your descendants. <sup>4</sup>They shall spring up among the grass like willows by flowing streams. <sup>5</sup>This one will say, 'I am the LORD's,' another will call on the name of Jacob, and another will write on his hand, 'The LORD's,' and name himself by the name of Israel."

**READING** 1 PETER 2:4–10

P A reading from 1<sup>st</sup> Peter, chapter 2.

<sup>4</sup>As you come to him, a living stone rejected by men but in the sight of God chosen and precious, <sup>5</sup>you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. <sup>6</sup>For it stands in Scripture:

"Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious, and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame."

<sup>7</sup>So the honor is for you who believe, but for those who do not believe,

"The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone,"

8and

"A stone of stumbling, and a rock of offense."

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. <sup>9</sup>But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. <sup>10</sup>Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

# The Passion of Our Lord According to St. Luke - Part 2: Luke 22:39-53

Evangelist: And he came out and went, as was his custom, to the Mount of Olives, and

the disciples followed him. And when he came to the place, he said to them,

CHRIST: "Pray that you may not enter into temptation."

Evangelist: And he withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and knelt down and prayed,

saying,

CHRIST: "Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me. Nevertheless, not my will,

but yours, be done."

Evangelist: And there appeared to him an angel from heaven, strengthening him. And

being in an agony he prayed more earnestly; and his sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the ground. And when he rose from prayer, he came to the disciples and found them sleeping for sorrow, and he said to them,

CHRIST: "Why are you sleeping? Rise and pray that you may not enter into temptation."

Evangelist: While he was still speaking, there came a crowd, and the man called Judas,

one of the twelve, was leading them. He drew near to Jesus to kiss him, but

Jesus said to him,

CHRIST: "Judas, would you betray the Son of Man with a kiss?"

Evangelist: And when those who were around him saw what would follow, they said,

CHORUS: "Lord, shall we strike with the sword?"

Evangelist: And one of them struck the servant of the high priest and cut off his right ear.

But Jesus said,

CHRIST: "No more of this!"

Evangelist: And he touched his ear and healed him. Then Jesus said to the chief priests

and officers of the temple and elders, who had come out against him,

CHRIST: "Have you come out as against a robber, with swords and clubs? When I was

with you day after day in the temple, you did not lay hands on me. But this is

your hour, and the power of darkness."







# Collect


