READING

1 PETER 2:4–10

P A reading from 1st Peter, chapter 2.

⁴As you come to him, a living stone rejected by men but in the sight of God chosen and precious, ⁵you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶For it stands in Scripture:

“Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious, and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame.”

⁷So the honor is for you who believe, but for those who do not believe,

“The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone,”

⁸and

“A stone of stumbling, and a rock of offense.”

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. ⁹But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. ¹⁰Once you were not a people, but now you are God’s people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

The Passion of Our Lord According to St. Luke - Part 2: Luke 22:39-53

Evangelist: *And he came out and went, as was his custom, to the Mount of Olives, and the disciples followed him. And when he came to the place, he said to them,*

Evangelist: *And he withdrew from them about a stone’s throw, and knelt down and prayed, saying,*

CHRIST: “Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me. Nevertheless, not my will, but yours, be done.”

And being in an agony he prayed more earnestly; and his sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the ground. Evangelist: *And one of them struck the servant of the high priest and cut off his right ear.*

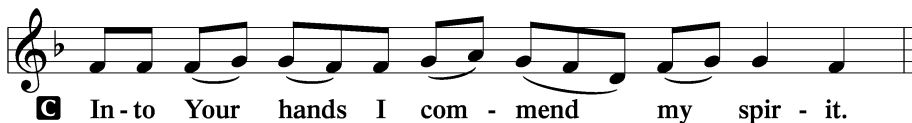
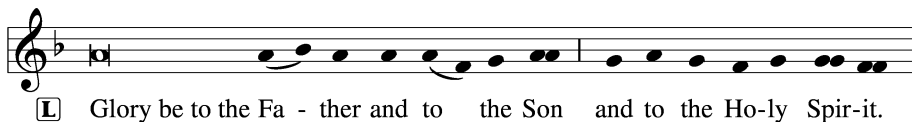
CHRIST: *But Jesus said,*
