



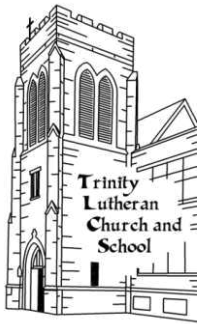

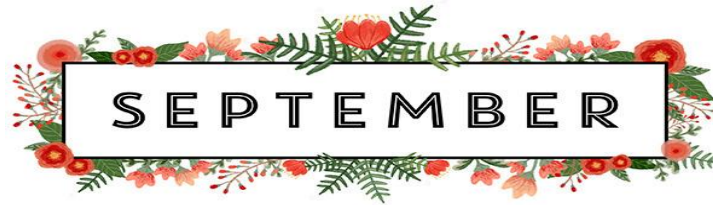

Catechetical Comments

A Series

THE APOSTLES' CREED

This month we continue our consideration of the First Article of the Apostles' Creed by taking up question 107.

107. Do people still have the image of God?

No, this image was lost when our first parents disobeyed God and fell into sin. Their will and intellect lost the ability to know and please God. In Christians God has begun to rebuild His image, but only in heaven will it be fully restored.

The *Catechism* continues its explanation of the First Article of the Creed by asking the question:

Do people still have the image of God?

It answers this question by saying:

No, this image was lost when our first parents disobeyed God and fell into sin. Their will and intellect lost the ability to know and please God. In Christians God has begun to rebuild His image, but only in heaven will it be fully restored.

It then presents the following Scriptures in support of this answer:

Genesis 3:8-10 – They heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. But the LORD God called to the man and said to him, “Where are you?” And he said, “I heard the sound of You in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked, and I hid myself.”

Genesis 5:3 – [Adam] fathered a son in his own likeness, after his image.

1 Corinthians 2:14 – The natural person does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are folly to him, and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned.

Psalms 17:15 – As for me, I shall behold Your face in righteousness; when I awake, I shall be satisfied with Your likeness.

Here's a mind blowing idea: Adam and Eve *had* the image of God! They existed in created perfection and yet they sinned. They listened to the voice of the serpent (Satan) and reasoned their way into rebellion. They walked away from the image of God, even hiding themselves from His presence. (How often have you done this?) When they conceived and had a son, he was not born in the image of God, but in the image of Adam (Gen. 5:3). This is important! Because it has put us in a state in which we, according to our sinful nature, do not accept the things of God, because they seem silly to us (1 Cor. 2:14). Look how the world mocks Him!

But believers in Jesus have received a new nature, which coexists with and lives in contrast (conflict) with our old nature. We have the Spirit of God living within us, restoring the image of God day by day, as we walk with Him in His Means of Grace. One day we will behold Him face to face (Ps. 17:15), and that image will be fully restored. Lord speed the day! ✠

WHY A LUTHERAN SCHOOL AND LUTHERAN EDUCATION

“Bring up your child in the training (“paideia” means education) and instruction of the Lord.” Ephesians 6:4

Why Should I Tithe?

We do not make God poor when we fail to give money to Him properly, but we do make ourselves poor if we do not give to the standards He sets for us in His Word, the Bible. God does not need our money, but we need to give the way the Bible tells us to in order to overcome the negative influence money and the things of this world can have on us. Listen to Jesus' words in Matthew 6 – "No one can serve two masters. For you will hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money."

Some of the teachings of the Bible are more difficult than others. For many, the teachings about money, possessions and offerings are among the most difficult. But God's instructions are for our good, not for our harm. If we follow His instructions we will be free and content. Jesus said in John 8:36 "If the Son sets you free, you will indeed be free." We also read in 1 Timothy 6:6 that "godliness with contentment is great wealth!" That is God's desire for His people: freedom, godliness and contentment. That is also the desire of Trinity for its members.

So, let us consider these five questions:

Question #1. To whom does my money belong?

Everything that I have really belongs to God. I am merely His manager of those things. As the prophet says in Haggai 2: "The silver is mine and the gold is mine says the Lord Almighty"

Question #2. What 5 requirements does God make on every Christian regarding money offerings?

First, the Lord wants me to make my money offerings willingly. 2 Corinthians 9:7 says: "You must each make up your own mind as to how much you should give. Don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. For God loves the person who gives cheerfully."

Next, the Lord wants me to make my money offerings to Him first. He is not pleased when I give Him leftovers. As Proverbs 3 instructs: "Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the first part of everything your land produces. Then He will fill up your barns with grain, and your vats will overflow with the finest wine."

Next, the Lord wants me to make my money offerings to Him regularly, that is, whenever I have income, whether I am able to attend worship that week or not. We read in 1 Corinthians 16:2: "On the first day of every week, each of you should put aside some amount of money in relation to what you have earned and save it for this offering. Don't wait until I get there and then try to collect it all at once."

Next, the Lord tells me that it is not the amount itself that is important. What is important is that I make my money offerings proportionately. In other words, I should give a generous percentage of the income the Lord enables me to earn through my work and investments. Or, as it says in Deuteronomy 16: "Each of you must bring a gift in proportion to the way the Lord your God has blessed you."

Finally, my money offerings to the Lord should also be made generously. Paul encourages in 2 Corinthians 8:1-4: “Now I want to tell you, dear brothers and sisters, what God in his kindness has done for the churches in Macedonia. Though they have been going through much trouble and hard times, their wonderful joy and deep poverty have overflowed in rich generosity. For I can testify that they not only gave what they could afford, but far more. And they did it of their own free will. They begged us again and again for the gracious privilege of sharing in the gift for the Christians in Jerusalem.”

Question #3. What if I serve the Lord faithfully, even exceptionally, in other areas? Does that mean I don't need to follow these directions about money offerings?

No matter how well or faithfully I may serve in some areas, the Lord expects me to follow His directions regarding money offerings also; and even excel in this area! 2 Corinthians 8:7 states it this way: “Since you excel in so many ways – you have so much faith, such gifted speakers, such knowledge, such enthusiasm, and such love for us – now I want you to excel also in this gracious ministry of giving.”

Question #4. Is it true that some people have tried tithing and it didn't work for them?

If that's true, then God's Word is not true. We should remember that the Bible does not say that tithing can be done without sacrifice. But God does say that the blessings will far outweigh any hardship if the tithing is done consistently and from the heart.

Question #5. Is getting a blessing from God my motivation for tithing?

No! The motivation is His amazing love for me. Consider these Bible verses – Galatians 2:20 “I myself no longer live, but Christ lives in me. So, I live my life in this earthly body by trusting in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me”. And, 2 Corinthians 8:9 “You know how full of love and kindness our Lord Jesus Christ was. Though he was very rich, yet for your sakes became poor, so that by his poverty he could make you rich.”

The Lord has blessed us with all that we need for this body and life. Today, we ask you to please prayerfully consider the following questions. If you live in a family setting, please talk and pray about them together:

- Have we been making first-fruit, regular, proportionate and generous (at least a 10% tithe) money offerings to the Lord from the heart?
- If yes, how additionally can we fulfill the mission needs of our church and school?
- If no, what steps can we take to move in a faithful direction?
