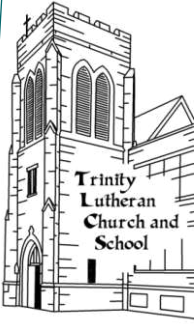

Catechetical Comments

A Series

THE APOSTLES' CREED

This month we continue our consideration of the First Article of the Apostles' Creed by taking up question 113.

113. Why do we close the explanation of the First Article with the words "This is most certainly true"?

Everything I confess in this article is plainly taught in God's Word, Holy Scripture. Therefore, I firmly believe it.

The *Catechism* continues its explanation of the First Article of the Creed by asking the question:

Why do we close the explanation of the First Article with the words "This is most certainly true"?

It answers this question by saying:

Everything I confess in this article is plainly taught in God's Word, Holy Scripture. Therefore, I firmly believe it.

This presents what could be said to be the most fundamental aspect of the Christian Faith and the Lutheran understanding of it. God's Word – Holy Scripture – is the only Source of Christian truth. Our feelings, our thoughts, our own opinions, do not matter when it comes to the Christian Faith. The only thing that matters is what God says.

I saw a bumper sticker once that said, "God said it, I believe it, that settles it." My immediate reaction was to agree with that statement, but the more I thought about it, the more I came to the conclusion that my faith – or lack thereof – has nothing to do with it. It

should be: "God said it, that settles it!" The only role my faith plays in that whole equation is whether the truth of God will benefit me or harm me. If I'm in Christ by grace through faith, then God's truth is a blessing to me; if I'm not in Christ, then God's truth becomes a curse to me.

So every aspect, every point, of Lutheran doctrine – indeed, of true Christian doctrine – is drawn from God's Word. If a doctrine cannot be demonstrated to originate in the pages of Holy Scripture, it has no bearing on Christian faith and life.

This, of course, stands in opposition to much "Christian" teaching in the world today. Some church bodies insist that their members adhere to doctrines originating in church councils or from supreme church leaders. Others promote the idea that individuals may receive special revelations directly from God. Neither of these "sources" are in keeping with the teaching of Scripture itself, which says that

"All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (2 Tim. 3:16).

This is not to say, of course, that every man and his Bible is a rule unto himself. God does call us to unity in the Faith, which follows upon the pattern established by Christ Himself of calling pastors to teach the Faith in accordance with the historic understanding of the Church throughout the ages. Therefore, we ought to read our Bibles, but we also ought to listen to our pastors who are called by God to teach the Faith to us. †

FROM THE SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

“Our Ancestry.com”

Ancestry.com has become quite a popular website today. People go there to find out not only their genealogy, but with that, who they are, where they come from, and their story. Because your story is important.

***Our country** has its stories. The stories of the Mayflower, the Revolutionary War, the writing of the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution, Manifest Destiny, and many more. These stories tell us who we are and how we got here as a nation.*

***Your family** has its stories. Maybe your ancestors were immigrants and you know the story of how they got here. You have stories of triumphs and tragedies, joys and hardships. These make you who you are as a family.*

*In the Bible, we hear our story **as Christians**. The accounts we hear tonight aren't just someone else's story, that happened a long, long time ago. These are the accounts of who YOU are and where YOU come from. These are accounts that shape us, and even more importantly, bind us together as Christians. The Church is very diverse, and rightly so. But we also have much in common.*

And it is more important than ever that we hear these accounts each year. So, we don't forget them and lose them, AND because it has become fashionable these days to make up your own story. To identify yourself in whatever way you see fit. This might mean cutting yourself off from your past, your history. Or it might mean appropriating a new identity as your own. When that is done, the past is no longer the rock from which we are hewn, but the clay we shape into whatever we want it to be.

But that is not the way of it with God or Scripture. We have a story, and we have an identity. This is who we are, and it is good.

Our story goes all the way back to the beginning. The genealogies in the Bible might be hard to read through, but they connect us to those who have gone before us. And the accounts we read in the Bible and the people we read about not only teach us about them, but about ourselves. Adam, Noah, Abraham, Israel, Ezekiel, Jonah, and the Three Young Men - all live on in us. This is where we have come from. This is who we are.

But there's one more story that tells us who we are and from where we have come - the most important story of all: of Jesus. When we are baptized into Him, His story becomes our story. We die and rise with Him to a new life. We ascend with Him. We are sons of God in Him. That is our identity: we are the baptized children of God.

That's why a part of the service tonight is a remembrance of Baptism. For it is our baptism that has grafted us into Christ and into this story. When we renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways, we are renouncing not only him, but also any other identity, HE tries to convince us of, or even who we might make ourselves to be. NO! My identity is not here or from him or in what I do - I am a baptized child of God.

So, when we go back and read through the accounts of the Scriptures - and yes, some of them are long! - this is our spiritual ancestry.com. This is our spiritual genealogical research. This is the rock from which we are hewn. The Rock that is Christ and all that He has done for us. And as that Rock fed His people manna and gave them drink in the wilderness, so He will give us the food and drink of the New Testament tonight. And our story will continue. A story to pass down to our children, and their children. A story that is important to know. This is who we are.

Let us hear again, remember, rejoice, and give thanks. Blessed Easter! Pastor GeRue

God's Calling

Hello Trinity family; we have talked much about stewardship of your time and talents, as well as of your financial resources entrusted to you by God. Today I would like you to take a look at the big picture of the life that God has given to you.

1 Peter 4:10-11 "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace: whoever speaks, as one who speaks oracles of God; whoever serves, as one who serves by the strength that God supplies—in order that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ. To him belong glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen."

Romans 12: 3-8 "For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness."

We are reminded that God grants each of us certain gifts, as He sees fit. He likewise requests each one of us to use that gift to further His kingdom. He does not leave room for excuses which we tend to offer, such as "I am too old", "I'm too tired", "I'm too young", or even "I'm scared". It doubtless will be uncomfortable stepping out of the "norm" of your day-to-day life, in order to pursue God's calling on your life, but God commands us to "Be strong and courageous", as He promises that "He will not leave you nor forsake you". And you can bet that the safest place to be is in the will of God.

So today I encourage you to meditate on God's will in your life. Is there something that you have been called to do but haven't? Do you feel God encouraging you to act upon His word? Or do you think to yourself "It was so long ago when I felt God's pull on my life, I tuned it out; surely He doesn't want me to act upon that calling now?" Listen again - maybe the calling has changed, but God still wants you to act. Every single day that He gives you is another day in which He desires your service here on earth. Whether He is calling you to bringing fresh cookies to a neighbor, join a Board here at Trinity, or if He is calling you to follow the excellent example of our dear Pastors, going to seminary and becoming an Ordained Minister in the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod; whatever your case may be, persevere in God's will so that when your work here on earth is done, and He calls you home, He will have reason to look upon you and say "Well done, good and faithful servant".

This is certainly a wonderful opportunity to serve many people in the community; we want them to see we are Christians by our love and concern for them and each other. Sooo come on down, the men of Trinity will be cooking Jacob's Meat brats. To have a successful two-day sale many hands are needed and there are many ways in which you can serve! There will be signup sheets on the spinner in the narthex for working in the stand or grilling. Also, donation items are needed or if you don't want to shop, cash for purchasing meat etc. are always appreciated. This sale last year was a huge success and very busy.

There will also be a bake sale with our brat fry. Our bake sales are well received so we hope all of you wonderful bakers will be willing to donate items. Pies, sweet breads, bars and cookies all sell well; be creative! If possible, it would help if you had your items wrapped and ready to sell; however, if not, no worries; we can do that. You may bring items to Trinity on Thursday 4/23 (small fellowship hall) between 8 am and 2:30 pm or to the sale site either day. Thank you!

The second sale will at the home of Jerry and Ellie Maynard, *W4908 Spring Hill, Sherwood* on May 1 & 2. These dates replace the usual June dates for the High cliff rummage sales, brat fry and bake sale. Again, this was a very successful fund raiser last year.
