- P** The friendship of the LORD is for those who fear him,
and he makes known to them his covenant. (*Antiphon*)
- C** **To you, O LORD, I lift up my soul. O my God, in you I trust;
let me not be put to shame; let not my enemies exult over me.
Indeed, none who wait for you shall be put to shame;
they shall be ashamed who are wantonly treacherous.**
- P** Make me to know your ways, O LORD; teach me your paths.

**The Passion of Our Lord
According to St. Matthew - Part 1: Matthew 26:1-29**

Evangelist: *When Jesus had finished all these sayings, he said to his disciples,*
CHRIST: “You know that after two days the Passover is coming, and the Son of Man
will be delivered up to be crucified.”

Evangelist: *Then the chief priests and the elders of the people gathered in the palace
of the high priest, whose name was Caiaphas, and plotted together in order
to arrest Jesus by stealth and kill him. But they said,*

CHORUS: “Not during the feast, lest there be an uproar among the people.”

Evangelist: *Now when Jesus was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, a woman
came up to him with an alabaster flask of very expensive ointment, and she
poured it on his head as he reclined at table. And when the disciples saw
it, they were indignant, saying,*

**CHORUS: “Why this waste? For this could have been sold for a large sum and
given to the poor.”**

Evangelist: *But Jesus, aware of this, said to them,*
CHRIST: “Why do you trouble the woman? For she has done a beautiful thing to
me. For you always have the poor with you, but you will not always have
me. In pouring this ointment on my body, she has done it to prepare me
for burial. Truly, I say to you, wherever this gospel is proclaimed in the
whole world, what she has done will also be told in memory of her.”

Evangelist: *Then one of the twelve, whose name was Judas Iscariot, went to the chief
priests and said,*

CHORUS: “What will you give me if I deliver him over to you?”

Evangelist: *And they paid him thirty pieces of silver. And from that moment he sought an opportunity to betray him. Now on the first day of Unleavened Bread the disciples came to Jesus, saying,*

CHORUS: “Where will you have us prepare for you to eat the Passover?”

Evangelist: *He said,*

CHRIST: “Go into the city to a certain man and say to him, ‘The Teacher says, My time is at hand. I will keep the Passover at your house with my disciples.’”

Evangelist: *And the disciples did as Jesus had directed them, and they prepared the Passover. When it was evening, he reclined at table with the twelve. And as they were eating, he said,*

CHRIST: “Truly, I say to you, one of you will betray me.”

Evangelist: *And they were very sorrowful and began to say to him one after another,*

CHORUS: “Is it I, Lord?”

Evangelist: *He answered,*

CHRIST: “He who has dipped his hand in the dish with me will betray me. The Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born.”

Evangelist: *Judas, who would betray him, answered,*

CHORUS: “Is it I, Rabbi?”

Evangelist: *He said to him,*

CHRIST: “You have said so.”

Evangelist: *Now as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to the disciples, and said,*

CHRIST: “Take, eat; this is my body.”

Evangelist: *And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, saying,*

CHRIST: “Drink of it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you I will not drink again of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father’s kingdom.”
